Backpacks First Five

Backpacks First Five is designed to help you take five steps towards individuals in your community who will be encouraged by receiving a backpack. Each of the five steps will also give you the opportunity to see God at work in and through your church.

Register your interest with Mission Georgia.

Fill out the registration form at www.missiongeorgia.org/backpacks. This will notify Mission Georgia staff that you are interested in Backpacks as a ministry.



Talk with the leadership of your church about the opportunity to serve your community by gathering and giving Backpacks.

- If you're a pastor, let your congregation know you are looking at bringing the Backpack ministry to the community. Find out who is interested through
 email, interest meetings or personal contacts.
- If you are a church member, ask to meet with your pastor or other leadership to discuss the opportunity to bring Backpacks to your community. Ask if
 the church is already involved in this type of ministry and discuss the possibility of taking further steps of action.
- · Give every member a chance to learn more about the opportunity to participate, whether it is youth, families, young adults or senior adults.



Connect with a local school or ministry.

- Decide on the type of backpack you would like to pack. It could be a child literacy backpack, maternity backpack, refugee backpack, human trafficking
 or foster kid backpack. A list of suggested items for these can be found at the Mission Georgia website. If you are connecting to a particular ministry,
 you may want to contact them for specific items they would like in addition to those suggested.
- Decide on a day to pack the backpacks and for them to be delivered to your school or ministry.
- Give specific ways the church can pray for the ministry and develop additional avenues of support.



Gather donations and/or volunteers to serve with the ministry that has been chosen.

- Publicize the need for donations of requested items for your backpack ministry. Make sure you create awareness that reaches all age levels and connects through various outlets (email, social media, etc.).
- Give a variety of ways for individuals to participate. Some can pray, some can pick up or deliver donations, and others can promote or donate funds.



Celebrate the ways your church served the community.

- Celebrate the backpack ministry. After you have delivered the backpacks or served with the ministry, make a big deal of it! With permission, post
 pictures on your church social media using the hashtag #missiongeorgia.
- Share brief testimonies during worship services and ask church members to continue to pray for those who are serving the vulnerable.
